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## Museum Adds Royalty to Roster

On Thursday, June 29, 2006, Museum President Brad LaRose and Treasurer Dave Rohr journeyed to Los Osos to meet with Gordon Crosthwait. Mr. Croswaith is the long-time owner of *La Condesa*, a 1926 Pullman open platform passenger car. This car was originally built for the Santa Fe Railroad as a diner-lounge-observation car number 1512. It has been modified and now includes 3 bedrooms.

Mr. Croswaith purchased the car around 1970 and ran it on Amtrak for many years. He is one of the founding members of the American Association of Private Railroad Car Owners and currently is a member of the Rail Passenger Car Alliance. Both groups are very active in refurbishing and running private cars.





For the past twenty years the car has been stored in Fullerton, California where Gordon has been refurbishing the car and working to bring it up to current Amtrak standards.

Brad and Dave accepted the donation on behalf of The Museum. Plans are to have it moved by rail to a spur in Santa Margarita where SLORRM can continue its refurbishment. Getting the car Amtrak compatible will be an expensive undertaking, but the reward of riding the open platform down the coast will make it well worth the time and effort.

# Pacific Coast Railroad Roundup

Railroad enthusiasts came from as far away as Pennsylvania and Florida. Although the majority of the visitors were from the central coast (Lompoc to Paso Robles), a large number made the trip from Los Angeles and the Bay Area. The Central Valley was also well represented.

The three steam locomotives of Rob Rossi's *Pacific Coast Railroad* worked tirelessly hauling train after train of happy people uphill and down, around the two-mile loop.



# **Emily Street Yard**

On Tuesday, June 27, 2006, Brad LaRose, Jarret LaRose, Ted VanKlavern and Mark VanKlavern moved the last piece of rolling stock out of the Sears Yard onto museum track in the adjacent Emily Street Yard.

The 50 foot long SP boxcar was loaded onto a Landoll hydraulic roll-back trailer provided by Dwight Peterson Low Bed Service. Loading went fairly quickly but the unloading required the help of two pickup trucks to tow the boxcar off the trailer onto the track.

Preparing the Emily Street yard to store the Museum's rolling stock and other material was a huge project. Starting in April, and often delayed by wet weather, the yard was completed by mid-June.

From a piece of land, full of weeds and piles of dirt, Brad LaRose and a crew of many, have built a clean and orderly storage yard for SLORRM.



### Museum Joins ARM


