# La Condesa Arrives in Santa Maria

Early on Monday morning, October 22, 2007 Museum *Vice President* **Karl Hovanitz** and *Treasurer* **Dave Rohr** climbed aboard *La Condesa* in Los Angeles for the trip to Guadalupe.

After seemingly endless months of planning and making arrangements, the Countess was pulled out of the spur in Fullerton where she had been parked for over 20 years and coupled to the back of Amtrak train 799 for the trip north.

After arriving in Guadalupe around noon, the 1926 Pullman Observation Car was coupled to Santa Maria Valley Railroad's Geep-9 and hauled to Santa Maria where it sits today.

# Track Removal from CMC Completed

The next phase of the track removal project at the California Mens' Colony (CMC) was completed on December 2, 2007. Brad LaRose, Duane Powell, Dave Rohr and Ted VanKlavern, using a crane and forklift provided by

Superior Crane Company, loaded over 300 railroad ties onto a flatbed truck and moved them to the Emily Street Yard. All that remains to be removed from CMC is approximately 7 dump truck loads of ballast.


## Thorne Family Photo Collection

In the Fall 2006 issue of *Coast Mail* we printed the picture of **Kelsey Thorne**, seen above, which had been given to us along with some railroad photographs without any information about him. We were soon put in contact with Kelsey's son **Charley Thorne**, who is a retired railroader living in San Luis Obispo. Charley told us a little about his father and let us copy some other railroad photos which we published in the Winter 2006 *Coast Mail*.

**Noah Bullock,** great-grandson of **Kelsey Thorne**, has donated nine railroad photographs to the Museum.

The collection, which dates from about 1915, includes; a picture of the roundhouse shot from Terrace Hill, one photo of a train at SLO depot, four photos of trains on the Stenner Creek trestle. The other four pictures are of a train wreck just north of the Cuesta Grade in 1915.

All of the photographs taken in and around San Luis Obispo are mounted in mattes bearing the name of *Frank Aston Photography*. Anybody know who he was? Maybe there are more of his railroad photos lying around.

### Walter Rice

One of the original members of the *Avila Valley Railroad Museum*, now the *San Luis Obispo Railroad Museum*, died December 12, 2007.

Walter E. Rice, Ph.D., was a Cal Poly professor for 36 years. He was well known in academic circles for his innovations in the teaching of Transportation Economics.

He was better known among Museum members and other railfans for his authoring books about rail transportation. He wrote with *Karl Hovanitz*, a book about the Swanton Pacific Railroad. His most recent work, *Rails of California's Central Coast*, will be offered for sale, by the Museum, at this year's Railroad Roundup in May.



#### **New Book Out**




Rails of California's Central Coast will be for sale at the Railroad Roundup


